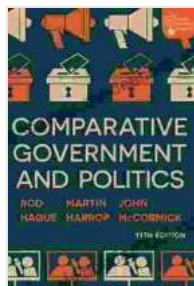

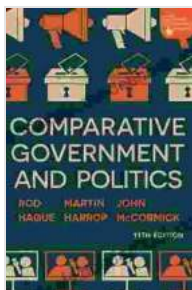
Overall
