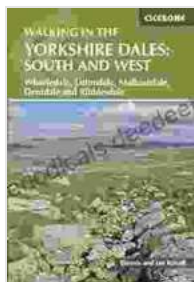

* ****Distance:**** 5 miles * ****Difficulty:**** Easy * ****Start/Finish:**** Arncliffe *

****Route:**** From Arncliffe, follow the River Skirfare upstream through the valley. Pass by the charming village of Litton and continue to a waterfall at the head of the valley. Return to Arncliffe by the same route.

Malhamdale

Malhamdale is one of the most dramatic valleys in the Yorkshire Dales. At its heart is Malham Cove, a towering limestone formation that offers stunning views of the valley below. Malhamdale is also home to Gordale Scar, a deep gorge with sheer limestone cliffs.



****Walking in Malhamdale:****

*** **Distance:**** 7 miles *** **Difficulty:**** Moderate *** **Start/Finish:**** Malham *** **Route:**** From Malham, walk up to Malham Cove and enjoy the views. Continue to Gordale Scar and explore the gorge. Return to Malham by the same route, or take a circular route via Janet's Foss, a beautiful waterfall.

Dentdale

Dentdale is a long, narrow valley that follows the River Dee. The valley is surrounded by high hills and offers some of the most challenging walking in the Yorkshire Dales. Dentdale is home to the village of Dent, which has a number of historic buildings and a lively market square.

*** **Distance:**** 12 miles *** **Difficulty:**** Challenging *** **Start/Finish:**** Dent *

****Route:**** From Dent, follow the River Dee upstream through the valley. Pass by the village of Cowgill and continue to the head of the valley. Return to Dent by the same route.

Ribblesdale

Ribblesdale is the northernmost of the Yorkshire Dales valleys. It is home to the River Ribble, which flows through a landscape of rolling hills and limestone cliffs. Ribblesdale is a popular destination for walkers and cyclists, and it offers a variety of walking routes to suit all abilities.

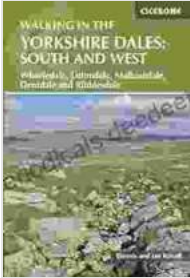

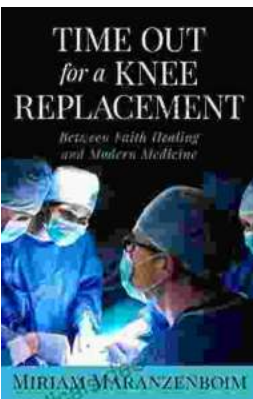
* ****Distance:**** 9 miles * ****Difficulty:**** Moderate * ****Start/Finish:**** Ingleton *
