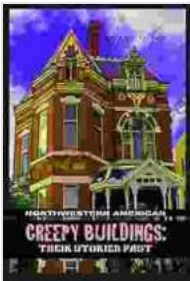

Lincoln County Mental Hospital, Oregon

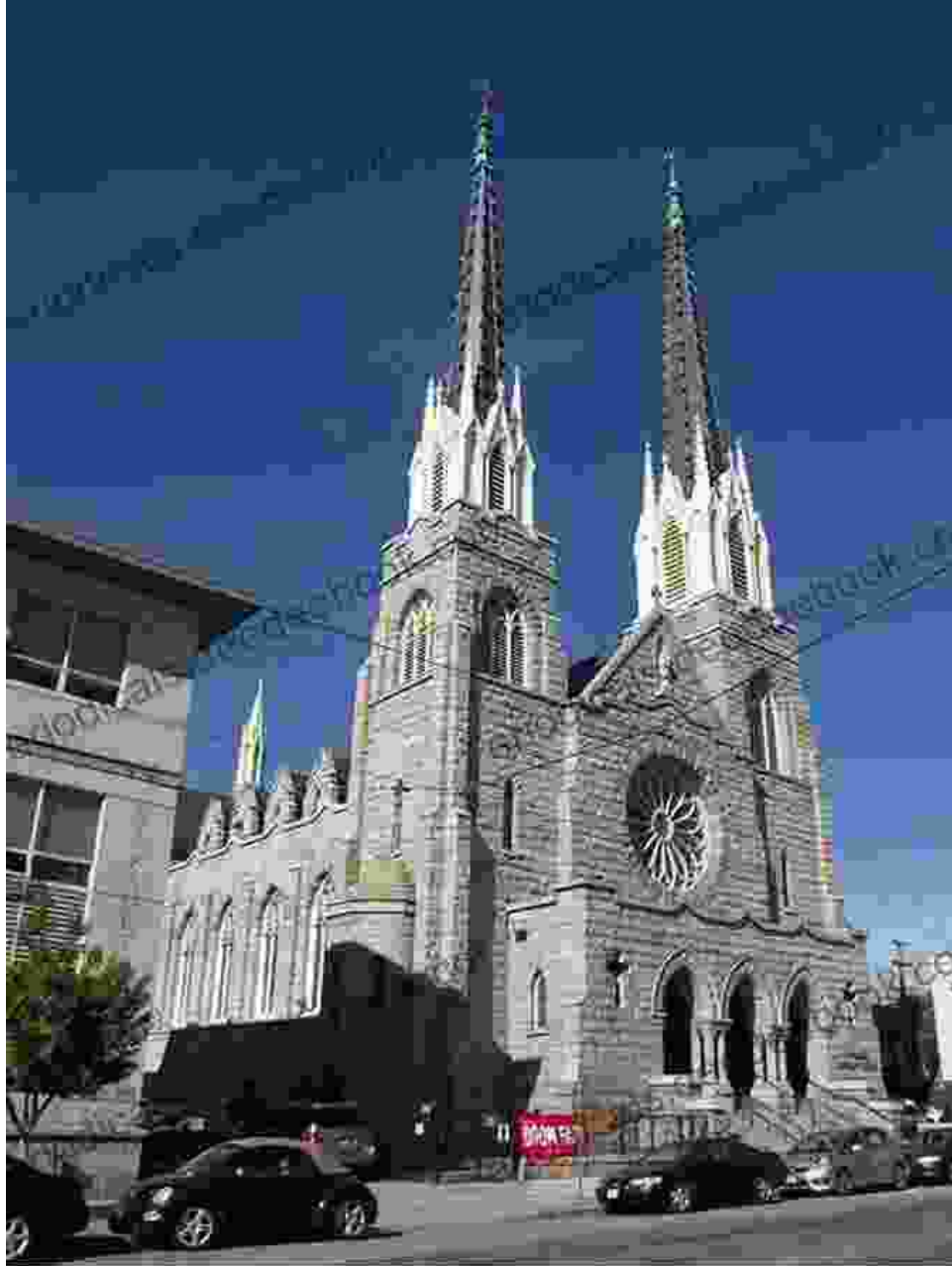

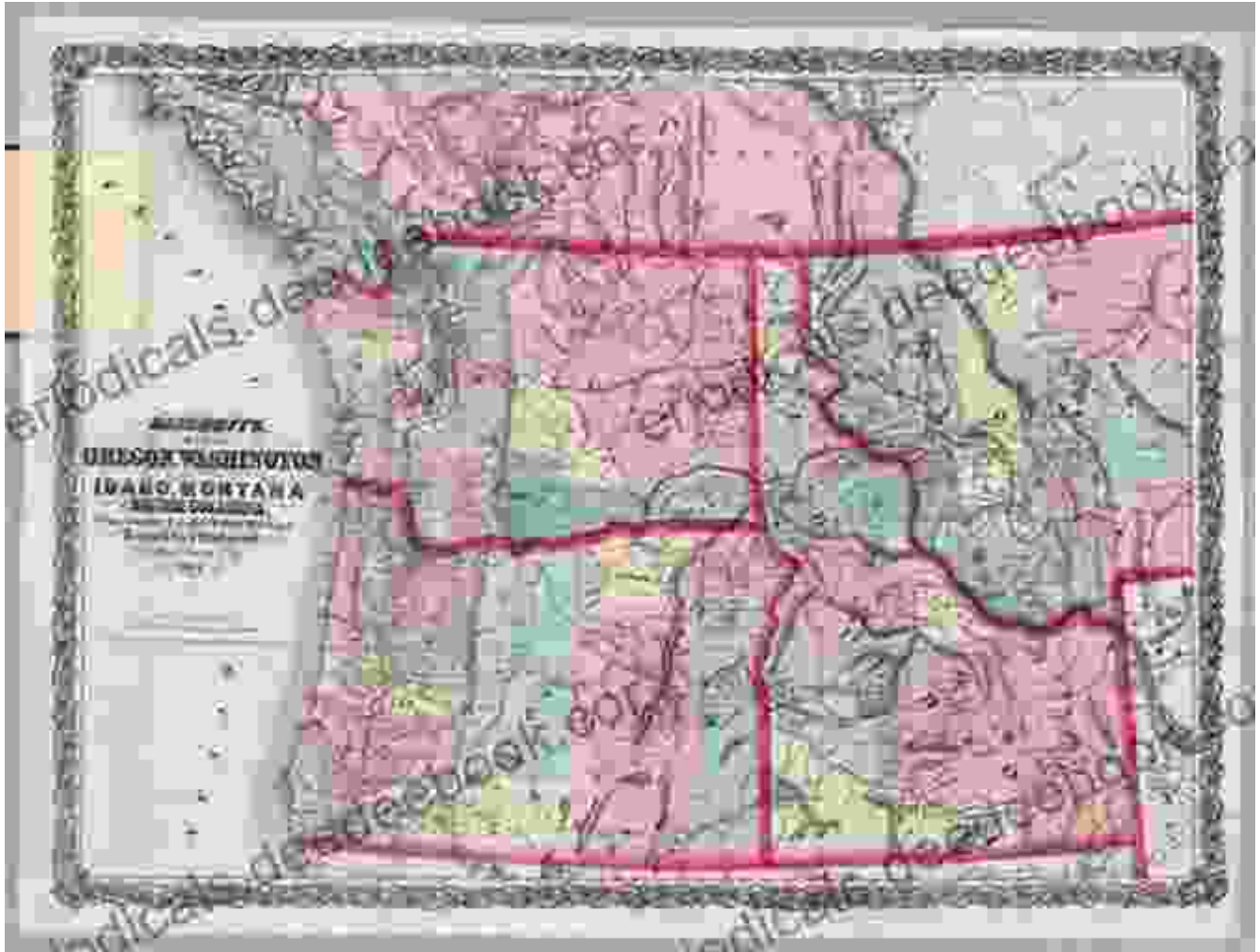
Old St. Paul's Church, California

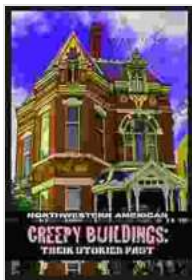

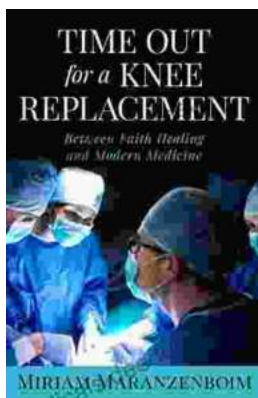
